Message from the Director



I received an email the other day from a salesperson asking if there was a good gimmick for selling Informix that he could use to push the product harder to customers in his geography. Fortunately, there is such a gimmick! I think the best way to answer this question is to provide a few examples.

Little or no DBA requirements - One of the presenters at the IBM Information On Demand (IOD) Conference described their installation, which supports the third largest dairy operation in the world, at 18 TB of data replicated across 40 Servers - and zero DBAs! Minimal administration requirements are a critical consideration for our partners and clients who are looking for opportunities to optimize cost. We are continually focused on simplifying or eliminating administration requirements with each product release. The new OpenAdmin API and OpenAdmin Tool (OAT) provide powerful administrative options that help to emphasize the clear cost advantage that Informix has over all the competitors.

Reliability - I had a senior sales leader in Asia tell me that he loves to sell Informix because after the sale the only time he hears from the customer is when they want more Informix! In other words, our relentless focus on quality ensures that our clients can deploy their solution with confidence.

Customer Satisfaction - Informix was rated #1 in customer satisfaction in the VendorRate Report for Q3. The VendorRate Report summarizes customer satisfaction ratings entered by technology professionals at our website, trade shows, professional conferences and virtual events. VendorRate also collects rating information in cooperation with user groups, trade associations, event management, and IT and telecom departments from organizations of all sizes.

Expanding IDS Lab to **Russia** and **Brasil**: The Moscow and Latin America Support Hubs By Michael Hiskey

IDS Support Teams are growing around the world. Today we are training new support engineers in Brasil and Russia to support growth in these areas. With IT spending from these countries growing by double digits (12.5% in Brazil; 18.7% in Russia), IBM is leading the charge by putting support engineers out in front of these markets.

To some of us who have been at IBM for awhile, the thought of "new hire training for Informix" sounds a bit unusual. But today this is happening around the world in our growth markets. Our IDS support engineers from the Russian EMEA Hub Extension in Moscow, Russia and the Latin America Advanced Support Hub in São Paulo, Brasil recently spent time in Lenexa, Kansas attending Informix Training University with other IDS experienced engineers from the Support and Development organizations.

Informix Technical University

Informix Technical Support just concluded their month long Informix Technical University (ITU) training held in Lenexa, KS. The ITU consisted of 22 unique courses designed to equip our support engineers to deliver superior service and exceed our customer's expectations. A total of 53 people attended with 23 individuals representing the majority of the worldwide support hubs. The ITU provided an excellent environment to establish worldwide unity for Informix support delivery and facilitated a sense of community among the participants. The ITU is yet another example of how IBM makes the world smaller and more relevant to each of us.

These world-wide Support Hubs represent an extension of the Development organization, and a mechanism for staying tightly connected with the Informix development organization. Many of these engineers have worked extensively with Informix technology for many years, either with customers and/or business partners. They are excited to be part of the growing team!

The new plan for growth is part of a strategy started by Les King, Director for Data Management Global Technical Support, to put people in the places where business is booming. In these emerging markets, the fast OLTP capabilities of IDS combined with its embed-ability for use in ISV and Business Partner applications make it the database of choice for many applications.

The response from local customers and business partners has been overwhelmingly positive. The activity has put new fuel into the IDS 'ecosystem' there, where the names and faces have remained remarkably stable over the years since IBM's acquisition of the Informix Database business in 2001.

These moves have helped those who have held on to IDS 7 for its legendary stability and understand the dynamic feature set and benefits of IDS 11. For many, having local engineers who speak their native tongue gives them calm assurance that IBM can support the upgrade as smoothly as possible. For this reason, some estimates show that new support requests (PMRs) are up as much as 100% year-over-year, with users calling in for answers to technical questions and fixes for special situations in their environments.

So, if you should call the support organization, don't be surprised if you hear a new accent to their English... But extend them an "oi, tudo bom?" or a "priviet, kak delah?" (both mean "hi, how are you?" in Portuguese and Russian, respectively).

Local Users Groups counterparts of the International Informix Users Group (IIUG) www.iiug.org are key to keeping users informed

about the Informix product roadmap and the continued development enhancements in IDS. IBM Brasil headquarters recently hosted a session on Tuesday, October 21st with over 50 attendees participating. The broad functionality of IDS v11.5 provided an excellent cornerstone to this day-long educational agenda for users and developers.

The morning session was intended for both IT management and technical audiences, with presentations about the changes to the local support organization, participating in the IIUG, and building a Local Users Group. Informix legend and noted author Carlton Doe, highlighted the agenda with a detailed presentation with real hands-on examples of the rich feature enhancements in IDS 11.

In the afternoon, the meeting focused on deep technical issues around developing and improving applications, led by long-time Informix Engineer Vlaunir da Silva. A native Brasilian and now resident of Miami, he was able to take his expertise and guide the audience through details about client connectivity, performance tuning, and query modifications in Portuguese, for the mostly Brasilian audience.

The audience remained actively engaged throughout the session, and asked many questions of the presenters. While some of them had seen Carlton's "IDS boot camp" presentation, they were still inspired by his animated demonstration of the new features of their favorite data server.

With such a strong start, we are sure to hear good things from this group. They have already talked about plans for a follow-up meeting in March of 2009, and are nominating people to assume leadership roles within the local user group, to help define the direction of this group as they move from a start-up to a fully functional operational.

Reinvigorating the Informix Community in the UK

This year we've been working with Bell Micro to reinvigorate the UK Informix partner community, with an emphasis on Independent Software Vendors (ISVs). Together, we have been onsite with dozens of existing Informix developers to demonstrate what 's new in IDS 11 and what's planned for the future. One of the key messages conveyed in these sessions was about the various facilities and resources available to IBM partners, such as the Channel Technical Sales team, the advanced technology team, the Virtual Innovation Centre, the IBM Innovation Centre, and hardware resources in Hursley, etc.

These presentations have been very well received and partners and end-users have all been very enthusiastic about the new features in IDS 11 and IBM's continuing commitment to the products.

ISV recruitment

Another activity was engaging with Oracle ISVs who wanted to port their applications to another database. We worked on two projects in this area, one which was so successful that our new partner was able to present it at the last IOD. We are still actively engaging with new Oracle ISVs, but because the process of porting and especially, testing, is a very long one, it can take time for these to come onboard fully. If there is a compelling reason to act for the ISV, it could be done in as little as six months, though. Because Pregem had a very compelling reason to act and an architecture that was very simple to migrate, they achieved the port in less than two months!

The process is well-defined and enjoys significant support in the form of a world-wide team of skilled resources who have porting experience. There is also enablement for the ISV, best practice advice and hand-holding as needed. We have also had some positive discussions with ISVs who want to "move up" from simple PC-based databases as well as ISVs who are using other enterprise database platforms.

Proofs of Technology

John Pickford, IBM IT Consultant Specialist, delivered the first iteration of Carlton Doe's IDS 11 Proofs of Technology in the UK. These classes were very well attended and with a dozen people on each of the three days. After going through the training, attendees commented on how simple it was and how well-organized the course was.

The concept is straightforward; there is a set of manuals for each course, one for instruction and one for labs; and a VMware image with Informix pre-loaded and, for various exercises, pre-configured. The instructor discusses the technology, much like a conventional training course, and the attendees then do the exercises. The exercises include installing Informix and replaying the installation, building a MACH11 "continuous availability fabric", various performance tuning exercises and many more. Attendees had a hands-on feel for just how easy it is to use all the impressive new features in IDS. Since the exercises are done on VMware instances, if something goes wrong, it's very easy to roll back to a "known good" position!

In addition, I was able to run these PoT's for the outsourced IT wing of the Maltese government and the local Informix partners .

Informix enablement plans for Q4 2008 and beyond

There are a series of IDS Proofs of Technology penciled in for early December:

- IDS 11.1 New Features
- IDS 11.1 Performance Tuning
- IDS 11.5 New Features

If you have attended the previous iteration of the 11.1 enablement courses, then you will only need to attend the last of these. The first two courses shown here are for people who could not attend the previous enablement courses.

We are also planning a three-day IDS 11 "Boot Camp" in late January or early February 2009.

Sales Spot Light on IBM Information On Demand (IOD)

The last week of October the Informix sales team spent an exciting 7 days in Las Vegas at the IBM Information On Demand (IOD) Conference. There was a great buzz in the air, not just because it was Vegas and not just because there is so much excitement around the IOD product set, but for Informix specifically! As Jerry mentioned, Stuart Litel, the International Informix User Group(IIUG) president, was awarded the Data Management Professional of the Year Award. In addition, six Informix professionals were honored in the first "Data Champion Awards" including Eric Herber, Kim Non Liew, Cindy Lichtenaur, Lester Knutsen, Walt Hultgren and Stuart Litel. A well deserved recognition for our Informix Data Champions for their "above and beyond" contribution to the overall community.

We topped Informix attendance numbers for this IOD over the previous two years. I heard great feedback from those who attended regarding the ability to network outside of their community, the ability to attract new customers, make new contacts, and get a better understanding of the overall IBM value to their companies.

What I enjoyed most at IOD was hearing from our customers and our partners about how they use Informix in their day -to-day operations, and how it makes them successful. I'd like to share some highlights from the presentations that I had attended.

Retail Customer and Partner

Leading European Fashion Retailer, Hiltl uses IDS and AVM Software to drive operational efficiency.

Nadine Brehm, AVM GmbH & Co Softbase KG Jeffrev Roberts. Hiltl

The key to this session was Hiltl speaking about the efficiency of their operation due to the AVM software. Their customers are able to custom order men's slacks from Germany and have them delivered to the US men's store in 4 working days. The Enterprise Resource planning software covers the entire operation, from ordering raw materials, manufacture and planning, to delivery at the retail outlet. Informix is invisible to the customer.

IDS is deeply embedded into the ISV solution and they tell us that "Informix is the perfect fit for retail and manufacturing focused industry." Very little maintenance is required and the solution allows the operation to grow without requiring additional resources. As a result of this presentation, several large American clothing retailers are now interested in this solution.

Winning the Race at Finish Line

Scott Reasinger, Finish Line

Scott had a fascinating presentation on how Finish Line uses IDS in its day-to-day operations to control inventories and share information across their stores in the 50 states. Using Informix allows them to maximize sales, maximize gross margins, and minimize markdowns and returns. Key to their operation is having instantaneous updates on the location of inventory, and allowing sales clerks to be able to reliably and quickly check inventory for waiting customers. A one-minute delay can cause long lines and customer dissatisfaction. It is particularly important during the holiday season to have a system that is always available -- a hiccup in their inventory system in November or December could be disastrous.

Banking Customer and Partner Session: Banking on Technology - the "Loan Factory"

Marco Brueders, G&H Bankensoftware AG Hemant Bhatia, Barclay Card, Barclay Bank

Hemant Bhatia, the solutions architect from Barclays Bank, described a need for a solution that is "best in class, agile for quick changes, and is market proven" that he can rely on and trust. He also had a requirement for completion and installation in less than 12 months. For this he choose G&H Banken Software and Informix.

Using Informix and G&H Software he found that the solution could handle high volumes of data, was reliable, had speed and excellent performance, and required low administration. He noted the **strong** commitment IBM has to Informix that gave him confidence to move forward with this solution. Marcos Brueders, the executive from G&H, quoted from Ambuj Goyal's opening remarks: "These applications allow you to 'Unlock your information from your Data Base," referring to his application's ability to allow the bank to understand the information they have. The banks using his solution can now properly service and market to their customers in an efficient manner - giving the customer better service, enhancing the bank's offerings and driving more revenue from operations.

Dairy Solution from New Zealand Taking Replication to the Terabyte level at Fonterra

As you can see Informix is everywhere. The Fonterra solution was not only interesting for its implementation of Informix but in the industry it serves. Fonterra is a global supplier of dairy ingredients co-operatively owned by more than eleven thousand New

Zealand dairy farmers. The byline from their website declares "The only thing that excites more than what we do today is what we can do tomorrow....Being a world leader is about winning tomorrow with new and exciting ideas." Fonterra depends on Informix for their manufacturing execution systems, and IBM Business Partner Oninit has brought the Fonterra solution to the future with IDS 11. Fonterra has a staff of ten that operate 40 server instances for a 24 by 7 operation. The key is the team spends about 1 day a month on Data Base Administration and data management. Fonterra, with the help of their business partner, recently upgraded to IDS 11 - new server, 4 core, 16 GB memory and 22 Terabytes of Storage in Raid 10. IDS 11 gave Fonterra improved performance, efficiencies in Enterprise Replication, and no restarts required to renegotiate. They found that Informix meets the need of an expanding business while maintaining a low TCO in a Global Operation that cannot afford downtime. (We also learned that a healthy cow gives about 200,000 glasses of milk in her lifetime and many other fun cow facts!)

IBM Mashup Center and IDS: Call to Action!

IBM has posted the IBM Mashup Center on Lotus Greenhouse. The greenhouse version of Mashup Center includes a public feed library, to which anyone can add a feed or feed mashup. The Greenhouse catalog get tens to hundreds of hits from potential IBM customers daily. This is a great opportunity to get some visibility for IDS by building IDS-related feeds or feed mashups with IDS and posting them in this public catalog.

To play with IBM Mashup Center on Lotus Greenhouse, get a Greenhouse account and try it out. Create feeds in the public catalog and be sure to **tag** them as Informix or IDS as accordingly. Use the search field to find existing feeds and feed mashups by tag.

About IBM Mashup Center

IBM Mashup Center combines two offerings:

- 1. InfoSphere MashupHub: lets you catalog information and also mix and match feeds (departmental, enterprise or external). Drag and drop feeds and wire them together for "data operations" (select, joins, merge, transform etc.).
- Lotus Mashups: lets you create pages (interactive views) by dragging and dropping widgets onto a palette and wiring them
 together. The widgets display information (typically from InfoSphere MashupHub) and/or perform different behaviors based on
 actions in another widget. Pages or widgets created for or in Lotus Mashups get cataloged back in InfoSphere MashupHub.
